

Look Out!

Navigating Today's Financial Markets By The Rev. Dr. Richard Young, President

Every day on the way to the office, I pass a square yellow sign that reminds me to slow down due to an impending dip in the road. Unfortunately, I have to admit that there are many times when I fail to slow the speed of my car and receive a jarring reminder of exactly why that sign is there. However, on other days, I manage to lightly tap on the brake pedal and gently glide over the dip.

The third quarter of 2019 was one of those tricky dips in the road. There have been warning signs along the way, and an occasional dip in the road is always to be expected. While TPF would prefer to travel with our partners down a road free of dips and obstacles, that is an unrealistic expectation. Looking back over the past 10 years, TPF's Balanced Fund has beaten the benchmark over 66% of the time. In fact, despite the current gloomy condition of the news, partners in the TPF Balanced Fund currently have a 13.7% return for 2019.

TPF's Balanced Fund returned 0.2% for the quarter and 13.7% year to date, outpacing the Lipper MATA Index by 0.80%.

As part of our bumpy journey, third quarter movement brought sector rotation from growth stocks to value stocks. The result being that TPF gave back some of the relative outperformance we have enjoyed over the last year and a half. The TPF Balanced Fund ride is still good with a 13.7% return outperforming the Lipper MATA index for the year. The TPF Small Cap Equity Fund and TPF Emerging Market Equity Fund managers are having an excellent quarter and year.

How do we do it? The formula is simple. TPF's Investment Committee and investor consultant, Segal Marco Advisors, select the best investment managers in each asset class. With their assistance, the TPF Balanced Fund is intentionally diversified across the asset classes. The diversification proved invaluable during the third quarter of 2019.



Impact and Inspiration: Endowment Fund or Donor Advised Fund?

What's the best way to create your lasting legacy? Is it through an Endowment Fund? Or maybe through a Donor Advised Fund (DAF)? TPF provides a variety of legacy giving vehicles, and these types of funds are two of the most popular.

However, the key is figuring out which works best for YOU. To help you decide, our experts have broken down the most important pieces of each.

Endowment Funds: Key Facts

- This type of fund allows the donor to impose a restriction that prohibits some or all of the fund from being spent currently.
- Once established, an Endowment Fund provides an immediate tax advantage.
- Future contributions are allowed to grow the Endowment Fund and provide additional charitable deductions.
- TPF requires an initial contribution of \$1,000 to establish an Endowment Fund.

Donor Advised Funds: Key Facts

- An DAF is the best giving vehicle when you intend to support multiple organizations.
- This type of fund may provide certain tax advantages.
- When a DAF is established, an irrevocable gift of cash or appreciated securities is made to TPF for an immediate tax deduction.
- Donors and successor donors retain advisory privileges with respect to the distribution of funds and the investment of assets in the account.
- TPF requires an initial contribution of \$1,000 to establish a DAF.

Here at TPF, we've seen both Endowments and Donor Advised Funds change many lives. From universities to homeless shelters and throughout the lives of church members, these legacy giving vehicles equip TPF partners to truly enable and expand mission.
